MANU AMPIM is an historian and primary (first-hand) researcher specializing in Africana Studies. He earned a Masters of Arts degree in History & African American Studies from Morgan State University in 1989. He is the Director of Advancing The Research in Oakland, CA.

Teaching Career:

He has taught in the Department of History at Morgan State University (Baltimore, MD), and at San Francisco State University in the Department of Ethnic Studies. Also, Ampim has studied at Oxford University in England, and collaborated on a NASA-sponsored research project, which examined the ancient climate and migration patterns in Africa. Since 2006, Prof.

Ampim has taught History and Africana Studies at Contra Costa College (San Pablo, CA). He also teaches a pioneering 7-Step Primary Research Methodology Course at Advancing The Research.

Pioneering Field Research:

For the past 37 years, Prof. Ampim has taken educational tours to North Africa and Central America. In addition, in 1989-1990 he conducted an extensive 13-country research tour to all of the major museums, institutes and libraries throughout America, Europe and Canada, which house ancient Egyptian, Nubian, and Kushite artifacts. Since the 1990s, he has completed various field research projects in Egypt, Nubia, Ethiopia, Sudan, South Sudan, Kenya, and Uganda to continue his primary research at dozens of indigenous communities and field sites to study ancient African social organization and spiritual culture, observe cultural retentions, document modern forgeries, and to record the vanishing evidence of classical African civilizations in the Nile Valley. His latest mission since 2011 has been to organize the Save Nubia Project (SNP) to help preserve the archaeological sites of ancient Kush and Nubia in the Sudan, which are threatened by the ongoing construction of a series of dams. The SNP collective has helped lead this effort in saving the remains of the classical Kushite and Nubian civilizations in Sudan, and other areas of northeast Africa. Ampim's body of work for more than three decades has earned him the recognition as one of the leading scholars on ancient African culture and contributions to the world.

ETHIOPIA: LAND OF ANCIENT KUSH

June 25: WASHINGTON / ADDIS ABABA Depart Washington International Airport via Ethiopian Airlines to Addis Ababa. Meals will be served on board.

June 26: ADDIS ABABA Upon your arrival at Bole International Airport in Addis Ababa, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. Then you will be taken for sightseeing around Addis Ababa and visit Africa Hall, Trinity Cathedral, Liberty Monument, Martyrs Square, the Ethnological Museum, and Mt. Entoto with its panoramic view. In the evening we will enjoy a welcoming dinner at a traditional Ethiopian restaurant, featuring dancers and musicians representing some of the country's many ethnic groups.

June 27: ADDIS ABABA/AXUM Early morning transfer to the airport for your flight to Axum. Axum was the capital of the long Axumite reign, one of the oldest African empires and represented a crucial trade connecting-point between Africa and Asia for almost a thousand years. Legends narrate in the Kebra Negast (Book of Kings) how the city of Axum as early as the 10th century BCE was already the city where the Queen of Sheba resided. Among the notable sights are the astounding array of towering granite obelisks or stelae, the Ezana's stone inscriptions, the stone Throne of the Judges, tombs of the kings, and the Church of St. Mary of Zion, containing crowns of past emperors of Ethiopia. It is in Axum that the Ark of the Covenant is allegedly kept. The well-guarded sanctuary chapel of the Ark of the Covenant is believed to be located there, and the visitor may approach, but never hope to enter. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. *Evening lecture.*

July 28: AXUM / ADWA drive to the Adwa Hills to visit the site, where the Ethiopian army defeated the Italians in the historic Battle of Adwa in March 1896. Continue our drive to the Temple of Yeha (8th century BCE), which is the oldest standing structure in Ethiopia. Return to Axum, balance of the day at leisure to explore Axum on your own. Dinner and overnight at your hotel. *Evening lecture.*

June 29: BAHIR DAR Fly to Bahir Dar on the southern shore of Lake Tana. The Blue Nile originates in Lake Tana, just as the White Nile originates in Lake Nyanza ("Lake Victoria") in Tanzania, Uganda, and Kenya. The two rivers merge together to form the Nile River in Khartoum, Sudan. Visit the majestic Tis Isat Falls (Smoke of Fire) where the waters of the Blue Nile thunder some 200 feet into a chasm. At Tis Isat Falls climb down to the base of falls for up-close look and climb back up from the other side. In the afternoon, visit the Bezawit Palace (formerly Palace of Selassie), and then drive to the Woyito Village to see the production of papyrus boats (tankwas). Proceed to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

June 30: BAHIR DAR/LALIBELA Fly to Lalibela. Drive with private minivans to Lalibela town. This location is named after the king who in the 12th century initiated construction of the eleven rock hewn churches, which have been hailed a wonder of the world. Visit 6 of the monolithic underground churches at Lalibela. Dinner and overnight at your hotel. *Evening lecture.*

July 1: LALIBELA Visit the remaining 5 churches, all of which date back to the 12th and 13th century C.E. UNESCO declared these incredible churches as World Heritage Sites in 1978. In the evening explore the town of Lalibela. Dinner and overnight at your hotel.

July 2: LALIBELA/JINKA Fly to Jinka City which is the gateway to the south Omo Valley and home to many indigenous tribes. Afternoon visit to Jinka University to meet with staff, and then a visit to the South Omo Research Center, which maintains an ethnographic museum, and promotes intercultural understanding with basic and applied research. *Evening lecture.*

NOTE: Omo Valley The groups in this region are unique and still maintain their traditional culture and beliefs in this vast area, which has become a special region in Ethiopia called the Southern Nations, Nationalities, and Peoples Region (SNNPR). The Omo Valley itinerary (July 3-7) is flexible which means that if we learn of, for example, a "Bull-Jumping" rite of passage for men coming of age and must be performed before he is permitted to marry, then we will alter our schedule to witness this ceremony. However, we will change only the dates, but keep all the main places of interest.

July 3: OMO VALLEY/JINKA Full day in Jinka to explore the town and visit an Ari village for an interview with a chief and group of elders. *Evening lecture.*

July 4: OMO VALLEY Drive through Mago National Park to visit a Mursi village, and in the afternoon visit the Me'en (Bodi) tribe. *Evening lecture.*

July 5: OMO VALLEY Drive to visit the Karo and Nyangatom villages and meet with elders and chiefs. *Evening lecture.*

July 6: OMO VALLEY Drive to Turmi to visit the Hamar. Full day around the Hamar village.

July 7: OMO VALLEY Drive to visit the Dassanech and Konso villages and meet with elders and chiefs. *Evening lecture.*

July 8: OMO VALLEY/ADDIS ABABA Morning drive to Jinka and flight to Addis Ababa. In the afternoon, continue sightseeing tour of historic Addis Ababa, including the Mercato Market and Menelik II Square. Also visit the National Museum (where the remains of Lucy and Selam are located), and the Shiromeda market. *Final evening lecture.*

July 9: ADDIS ABABA / WASHINGTON, DC Evening departure from Addis Ababa for your return flight home. Arrival in Washington, DC the next morning.

July 10: WASHINGTON, DC Arrival in Washington, DC early morning local time.

TOUR CONDITIONS

AIR TRANSPORTATION: All flights will be aboard Ethiopian Airlines (both international and domestic).

BAGGAGE: Limited to one normal size suitcase, the weight of which should not exceed 50 pounds. Flight bags, cosmetic bags, briefcases, and camera cases remain in the personal care of tour members and are not included in the 50 pounds.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS: Two persons sharing a room with separate twin beds and a private bath.

A limited number of single rooms are available at \$280.00 supplemental cost. Confirmation required before departure.

MEALS – THREE MEALS PER DAY: Full breakfast, lunch, and dinner.

SIGHTSEEING: As detailed in the itinerary, using comfortable and convenient transportation. English speaking escort and local licensed guide. All entrance fees are included when applicable to specified sites.

TIPS: Tips associated with portage at the hotels, meal gratuities, GUIDES and DRIVERS rendering services are included.

TAXES: Service charges as imposed by lodging facilities, taxes by local administrations and government authorities on lodging are included on all services rendered to the group. Airport taxes and fuel surcharge are included in the price of the tour and are subject to change without prior notice.

THE TOUR PRICE DOES NOT INCLUDE: Expense of passports, e-visa, laundry, wines, liquors, after meal coffee or tea or items not found on the menu, excessive baggage expenses, and all items of a personal nature, plus those not listed as being included in the tour price.



REQUIREMENTS FOR TRAVEL

SUBJECT TO CHANGE

PASSPORT – American citizens traveling abroad must have a valid passport. Non-American citizens need to check with ATR for requirements.

VISA: Ethiopia – Required. Passengers will obtain their own e-visa (electronic visa) for \$52.00.

VACCINATION: None at this time.

BOOKING AND CONDITIONS: Deposit and payment. A deposit of \$500.00 per person is required at the time of booking. Final payment must be made no later than 60 days prior to departure.

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellations must be made in writing. Cancellations made up to 60 days prior to departure, refunds will be made less \$500.00 per person administrative fee and airline nonrefundable deposit. Cancellations made 59-36 days prior to departure will pay an \$800.00 per person administrative fee. Cancellations received 35 days or less prior to departure must pay a charge equivalent to 75% of the cost of the basic tour cost from Washington, DC (or from Addis Ababa if not travelling with the ATR group from Washington, DC).

NO SHOW- NO REFUND. Cancellation charges with medical reasons certified by a hospital and accepted by the airlines and suppliers will only be made based on refunds from suppliers and less \$500.00 per person administrative fee. **TRAVEL INSURANCE IS HIGHLY SUGGESTED.** No refunds for services or sightseeing rendered and not used by tour members. In the event departure does not reach the minimum required number prior to departure, Advancing The Research **RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CANCEL**, withdraw or change the tour in whole or in part at any time in the event a change is deemed necessary by ATR.
